

#### **How to use the Candidate Learning Center**

- The flipbooks shown below match your degree status in the Member Center. (Entered Apprentices will only see the Entered Apprentice degree, Fellow Crafts will see the Entered Apprentice and Fellow Craft degrees, and so forth.)
- Select the name of the degree course below to open each flipbook in a new window.
- Thoroughly review each flipbook to immerse yourself in the lessons of each degree. If any questions come up during your review, make a note of them to discuss them with your coach.
- Once you feel adequately prepared for each degree, you can take the final exam for the course
- A score of 70 percent is required to pass each course. Once you pass, a checkmark will appear in the box in the "passed" column and your score will appear in the "score" column. You can take the test as many times as you would like. If you score a new, higher score, it will replace your previous score in the score column. Record of your passing the course will also appear in your member record in the "Basic Masonic Education Courses" section.



#### THE TRUE LIGHT!



#### **CHIVALRIC MASONRY:**

The Order of the Red Cross: The story told in the ritual for the Red Cross acts as a link between the Capitular Degrees and the ones that follow and bridges the period between the Old and New Testaments.

The Order of Malta: The story of this order begins by making the candidate a Knight of St. Paul or the Mediterranean Pass.

The Order of the Temple: Confers knighthood on the pilgrim making him a Knight's Templar. Every Christian Mason should be a Knights Templar.

#### CRYPTIC MASONRY

Royal Master: The Temple is nearing its completion and certain Overseers are anxious to receive the Master Word and be honored with the rank of Royal Master before their employment ceases. Shortly before his death Hiram Abif explains to one of these Overseers, Adoniram, that with patience and industry he will, in due time, receive it. This discourse is widely regarded as the most beautiful in any Masonic Degree.

Select Master: The preparations for the building of the Temple having commenced in the Mark Master Degree, the three Grand Masters are anxious that the form of the sacred treasures, including the Ark of the Covenant, could be lost forever in the event of the Temple being sacked. They therefore arrange for a small number of Select Masons, sworn to secrecy, to construct a secret vault beneath the Holy of Holies and deposit replicas therein.

Super Excellent Master: The Temple had stood in all its glory for nearly 400 years but had then fallen to Nebuchadnezzar and his army. The King and his principal citizens were taken into captivity in Babylonia. Zedekiah, Nebuchadnezzar's puppet King, has rebelled against him and fled, leaving the remaining citizens to defend the Temple and pledge their devotion to God.

#### CAPITULAR MASONRY

Mark Master: It concerns the workmen building King Solomon's Temple. The Degree of Mark Master teaches the candidate the value of workmanship, honesty, and charity and how they received their wages.

Past Master: In the York Rite system, the Past Master is a symbolic degree, and the candidate isn't actually installed as the Master of a Lodge.

Most Excellent Master: Deals with the completion and dedication of King Solomon's Temple.

Royal Arch Mason: The completion of the story started in the Symbolic Lodge Degrees, about the search for secrets that were once lost now discovered.



## Donie Brosas Navarro Biography

Donie Brosas Navarro was born on Monday, September 28, 1942 in Bacao General Trias, Philippines. Parents are Florentino Morato Navarro and Pilar Brosas Navarro. 1962 I graduated from High School and enlisted in the military, Friday, October 09, 1964, serving 22 ½ years in the United States Navy. During my service I was stationed on various ships, USS Parsons, DD949 (Destroyer) USS Cavalier APL 134 (Cargo ship), USS America (Carrier) and well as Serving in Vietnam, 1969 to Late September 1971 (Stationed in Vietnam for 1 year and 6 months).

Then I received an order to report to Vallejo, California to Submarine Group for duty in U.S.A. Enroute, I made a stop and married my wife, Saturday, October 2, 1971. We have two children, both lovely girls, the oldest was born at Travis Air Force Base, 1973, and the youngest, was born in Naples, Italy, 1975. I was stationed in Naples for 3 years, attaining rank of Chief Petty Officer before transferring to serve at South Waymouth, Massachusetts for 3 years, 1977 to 1980.

After duty in Massachusetts for 3 years, transferred to sea duty aboard USS Ranger, homeport, San Diego, California. Sea duty from 1980 to 1983, served as leading Chief on USS Ranger and then transferred to shore duty, North Island, San Diego, California; retiring from the Navy on Saturday, May 31, 1986. Subsequently working at Commissary, Naval Training Center, then produce Manager at Mare Island Naval Shipyard and later at Beal Air Force Base.

Additionally, to my Military and Civilian Careers, I became an active member of Freemasonry. Joining Bagong Buhay Lodge No. 17, The Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of the Philippines, and on June 1974 becoming a Master Mason and affiliating with General Douglas MacArthur Lodge No. 853, The Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted masons of California, 2012, and Valley Lodge No. 135, 2015.

I have received Master Mason of the Year and Hiram Award and having the honor of becoming a Past Master twice, 2019 and 2023. I am set to receive the Golden Veteran Award for 50 years of service to Masonry, Saturday, April 13, 2024.

I express my gratitude to Valley Lodge No. 135 for this honor and extend my thanks to all who supported me throughout my journey in Masonry
