



Masonic Education

I love reading papers, specifically research papers, about ancient times and ritual. Found one particular fond of: example, we currently spell "Tiler" but history shows at one time it was spelled "Tyler". Example: Master to Junior Deacon: What is the chief Care of a Mason? "To see that his lodge is

tyled."



One particular sentence is Master declaring the lodge is now opened: "This Lodge is open, in the Name of God and holy St. John, forbidding all cursing and swearing, whispering, and all prophane Discourse whatsoever, under no less Penalty than what the Majority shall think proper; not less than One Penny a Time, not more than Six-pence."

Notwithstanding the lack of documentation, managed to trace the antecedents of one particular aspect of the opening ceremony, namely the rehearsal of the officers' duties. This particular piece of dialogue first makes an appearance in Pritchard's Masonry Dissected of 1730, not as an opening but simply as part of the dialogue lecture of the EA degree in

that section discussing the form of a lodge.

- Where Stands your Master? In the East
- Why so? As the sun rises in the east and opens the Day, so the Master stands in the East [with his Right Hand upon his Left Breast being a Sign, and the Square about his Neck] to open the Lodge and to set his Men at Work.
- Where stands your Wardens? In the West.
- What's their Business? As the Sun sets in the West to close the Day, so the Wardens stand in the West, with their Right Hands upon their Left Breasts being a Sign, and the Level and Plumb-Rule about their Necks, to close the Lodge and dismiss the Men from Labour, paying their Wages.
- Where stands the Senior Enter'd 'Prentice? In the South.
- What is his Business? to hear and receive Instructions and welcome strange Brothers.
- Where stands the Junior Enter'd 'Prentice? In the North.
- What is his Business? To keep off all Cowans and Eavesdroppers.
- **if a Cowan (or Listner) is catch'd, how is he to be punished?** To be plac'd under the Eves of the House (in rainy Weather) till the Water runs in at his Shoulders and out at his Shoos.

The New Masonic Trestle-Board, adapted to the Work and Lectures as practiced in the Lodges, Chapters, Councils, and Encampments of Knights Templars, in the United States of America. By Charles W. Moore, editor of the Freemasons" Monthly Magazine. 1868

Chapter IV, on the qualifications and Duties of Candidates for Freemasonry

Whosoever, from love of knowledge, interest, or curiosity say the Constitution, desires to be a Freemason, is to know that, as his foundation and great corner-stone, he is to believe firmly in the Eternal God, and to pay that worship which is due to him as the Great Architect and Governor of the Universe. A Freemason is obliged, by his tenure, to observe the moral law, and, if he rightly understands the royal art, he cannot tread in the irreligious paths of the unhappy Libertine, or stupid Atheist; not, in any case, not against the great inward light of his own conscience.

He will likewise shun the gross errors of bigotry and superstition; making a due use of his own reason, according to that liberty wherewith a Mason in made free. He is charged to adhere to those grand essentials of religion, in which all men agree; leaving each Brother to his own private judgement, as to particular modes and form a Whence it follows, that all Freemasons are to good men and true – men of honor and honesty – by whatever religious names or persuasions distinguished – always following the golden precept, "Of doing unto all men as they that all men should do unto them" and of worshipping God after that manner and form, which they conscientiously believe to be most acceptable in his sight."

Another of the Constitutions further provides, that no person shall be admitted a member, unless he be "free born; of mature and discret age; of good report; of sufficient natural endowments, and senses of a man; with an estate, office, trade, occupation, or some visible way of acquiring an honest livelihood, and working in his craft, as becomes the members of this most ancient and honorable Fraternity, who ought, not only to earn what is sufficient for themselves and families, but likewise something to spare for works of Charity, and supporting the true dignity of the royal Craft."

"No Brother shall propose, for admission into this ancient and honorable Society, any person, through friendship or partiality, who does not possess the moral and social virtues, a sound head and a good heart; and who has not an entire exemption from all those ill qualities and vices which would bring dishonor on the Craft."



CHIVALRIC MASONRY:

The Order of the Red Cross: The story told in the ritual for the Red Cross acts as a link between the Capitular Degrees and the ones that follow and bridges the period between the Old and New Testaments.

The Order of Malta: The story of this order begins by making the candidate a Knight of St. Paul or the Mediterranean Pass.

The Order of the Temple: Confers knighthood on the pilgrim making him a Knight's Templar. Every Christian Mason should be a Knights Templar.

CRYPTIC MASONRY

Royal Master: The Temple is nearing its completion and certain Overseers are anxious to receive the Master Word and be honored with the rank of Royal Master before their employment ceases. Shortly before his death Hiram Abif explains to one of these Overseers, Adoniram, that with patience and industry he will, in due time, receive it. This discourse is widely regarded as the most beautiful in any Masonic Degree.

Select Master: The preparations for the building of the Temple having commenced in the Mark Master Degree, the three Grand Masters are anxious that the form of the sacred treasures, including the Ark of the Covenant, could be lost forever in the event of the Temple being sacked. They therefore arrange for a small number of Select Masons, sworn to secrecy, to construct a secret vault beneath the Holy of Holies and deposit replicas therein.

Super Excellent Master: The Temple had stood in all its glory for nearly 400 years but had then fallen to Nebuchadnezzar and his army. The King and his principal citizens were taken into captivity in Babylonia. Zedekiah, Nebuchadnezzar's puppet King, has rebelled against him and fled, leaving the remaining citizens to defend the Temple and pledge their devotion to God.

CAPITULAR MASONRY

Mark Master: It concerns the workmen building King Solomon's Temple. The Degree of Mark Master teaches the candidate the value of workmanship, honesty, and charity and how they received their wages.

Past Master: In the York Rite system, the Past Master is a symbolic degree, and the candidate isn't actually installed as the Master of a Lodge.

Most Excellent Master: Deals with the completion and dedication of King Solomon's Temple.

Royal Arch Mason: The completion of the story started in the Symbolic Lodge Degrees, about the search for secrets that were once lost now discovered.
