Also, for keeping us safe and able to come back from our multiple charity work overseas to the islands of Philippines. I laso want to thank all of you for supporting us with your open pockets and praying for our safety while thousand miles away from our families. Being far from our families could be the hardest part of our journey traveling to different island of Philippines to provide our assistance to our less fortunate country men, and kids. We first travel to island of Dumaguete to attend the Philippines Ancom April 26-28, it was a very memorable experiences being under severe hot weather. But that is nothing compare to the overwhelming joy of seeing your Brothers all over the world joining together with one common goal, to provide assistance to those who are in needs and also promoting the missions and visions of masonry all over the world. After 3 days in Dumaguete we travel back to Cebu to his small town of Moalboal and Barangay Alcantara to see the people who will benefits from our medical mission. April 29 is the day for operation TULI (circumcisions), EKG/ECG testing, Blood Sugar testing and cervical cancer screening test and other medical services. There are medical personnel, doctor and nurses, even their Vice Mayor and Barangay officials in the site when we arrived and we also saw few kids who just had their procedure and got circumcised. This is also a very pleasant feelings, seeing those people and kids smiling and have joy in their heart getting free services that they would never get if Masons like us won't plan a philanthropic activity like this. It was a very successful joint project of Modesto Lodge 206 and Valley Lodge 135. Congratulations to the current Master of these lodges, your good works will stay in the heart of those people you helped.

May 3rd, we woke up early to meet the Brethren of Governor Ferrer Lodge 366 at the school where we will going to give the 150 school bags with supplies, 2 desktop computers, and feed the students after the program. We gave away 175 packed of foods and drinks to those students and teachers. We have a very well-organized program and we saw how happy those students are and their teachers. The principal and parent's association leaders approached me and saying they are really looking forward in the future to have a drinking water station in that campus, which is badly needed all the time, especially summer time, it's a very humid and hot weather in there while we are doing our program. I told them I will bring it to the attention of the lodge members and told them will give them updates in the future. After this program we went to General Trias Medicare Hospital to give our donations of 5 boxes of different kinds of medical supplies. gloves, mask, sanitizer, and Sani wipes/sprays and more) The hospital is very thankful to our donation they mention that their hospital have a very limited supplies and have many patients that are also cannot afford to buy. Our donation will be use to those patients who are really in needs and cannot afford to buy what they needed while in the hospital. This hospital is a government hospital that is why all patient are free of services but most of the time they need to buy what they need during hospitalizations. After our program here we took pictures and then go to another charity work that day which is going to department of education to give our 1 box of slightly used books, 1 desktop computer and \$300.00 donations. They also have a program for us, which end up out third program of the day. All program started with a prayer then speech from our WM Donny Navarro, Gov, Ferrer Lodge #366 WM Aldous Angeles, and the head of their department which I forgot their names and other government official like city councilors, brgy captain Jaime Clamosa and Board Member Maurito C. Sison of 6th district of Caivite. Each program took about an hour, so it's like about 4 hours of talking and listening to all their appreciation and being so thankful to Valley lodge #135 for a big support and great help to assist and provide what we can to all Filipino country men specially the kids the kinder and grade 1 students. After each program we received certificates of appreciation to all our Donors and Sponsors. We cannot thank you all enough, because of you, we created a big impact to the lives of all the receivers of our generous donations that will help them and I'm sure that they will remember this moment for the rest of their life that there is this people and members of a Masonic Valley Lodge No. 135 that was there to come from overseas to give their time and

donations. Again, thank you so much to all of you from the bottom of my heart. Masonic Definition: alluded to during opening, set the craft at work and give necessary instructions.

One of Freemasonry's oldest symbols is the Masonic trestle board. The trestle board is, literally and figuratively speaking, the blueprint of which our ancient fraternity was built upon. In the days of the stonemasons' guild, a trestle board was a board, sometimes on an easel, where the plans for construction were laid for apprentice masons to follow.

• Is it something received via e-mail or snail mail, to be thrown in the inbox, taken out later and put in the circular file? Oh Yea.

Trestleboard's are the essential communication tool of the Master. For many members it is the ONLY contact that they have with their lodge and gives them a feeling of knowing the active members of the lodge by reading their names in the Trestleboard.

Select the name of the degree course below to open each flipbook in a new window.


Thoroughly review each flipbook to immerse yourself in the lessons of each degree. If any questions come up during your review, make a note of them to discuss them with your coach.

CHIVALRIC MASONRY:

The Order of the Red Cross: The story told in the ritual for the Red Cross acts as a link between the Capitular Degrees and the ones that follow and bridges the period between the Old and New Testaments.

The Order of Malta: The story of this order begins by making the candidate a Knight of St. Paul or the Mediterranean Pass.

<u>The Order of the Temple:</u> Confers knighthood on the pilgrim making him a Knight's Templar. Every Christian Mason should be a Knights Templar.

CRYPTIC MASONRY

Royal Master: The Temple is nearing its completion and certain Overseers are anxious to receive the Master Word and be honored with the rank of Royal Master before their employment ceases. Shortly before his death Hiram Abif explains to one of these Overseers, Adoniram, that with patience and industry he will, in due time, receive it. This discourse is widely regarded as the most beautiful in any Masonic Degree.

Select Master: The preparations for the building of the Temple having commenced in the Mark Master Degree, the three Grand Masters are anxious that the form of the sacred treasures, including the Ark of the Covenant, could be lost forever in the event of the Temple being sacked. They therefore arrange for a small number of Select Masons, sworn to secrecy, to construct a secret vault beneath the Holy of Holies and deposit replicas therein.

Super Excellent Master: The Temple had stood in all its glory for nearly 400 years but had then fallen to Nebuchadnezzar and his army. The King and his principal citizens were taken into captivity in Babylonia. Zedekiah, Nebuchadnezzar's puppet King, has rebelled against him and fled, leaving the remaining citizens to defend the Temple and pledge their devotion to God.

CAPITULAR MASONRY

Mark Master: It concerns the workmen building King Solomon's Temple. The Degree of Mark Master teaches the candidate the value of workmanship, honesty, and charity and how they received their wages.

Past Master: In the York Rite system, the Past Master is a symbolic degree, and the candidate isn't actually installed as the Master of a Lodge.

Most Excellent Master: Deals with the completion and dedication of King Solomon's Temple.

Royal Arch Mason: The completion of the story started in the Symbolic Lodge Degrees, about the search for secrets that were once lost now discovered.












